Jones Road Landfill Site
September 21/2009 – Deputation to Kenora City Council by Black
Sturgeon Property Owners Association represented by Dan

Olscamp, President.

Re: Council Vote regarding Jones Road Landfill Site

My name is Dan Olscamp. I am here today both as a concerned permanent resident of Black Sturgeon Lake and as the president of the Black Sturgeon Lake Property Owners Association representing a number of residents from Peterson Rd., James Rd., Ritchie Rd., Worona Rd. and Bruckenberger Rd. It is my understanding that Council is planning to vote today on a recommendation to accept the Jones Road Landfill Site as the principal landfill for the City of Kenora. It appears to me that this vote will be a rubber stamp on the recommendations of the Operations Committee.

I have spoken to the head of Operations for the city who has informed me that the Solid Waste Operations have their own budget which will see considerable savings with the use of Jones Road Landfill versus the substantially increased cost of shipping it to Winnipeg. I was told there are copies of the initial consultants' reports available entitled the Kenora Waste Management Master Plan. There is also, I am told, monitoring of the landfill site occurring and these reports I have been led to believe are available to the public.

I came here today fearing for the health of the Black Sturgeon Lake watershed. Jones Road Landfill abuts Silver Lake which is upstream of Black Sturgeon. I was going to ask for a delay of your vote to accommodate a public meeting to discuss this contentious issue. Everyone I talked to in relevant city departments gave me the impression I would be wasting my time doing this. If this is the case and you have already made up your minds and are unanimous in your decision then so be it. If however you have any doubts about the wisdom of this decision please let your vote reflect that.

Personally I am sceptical of the science and I know I am not alone in this view among the residents of Black Sturgeon. Putting a landfill site anywhere on the Canadian Shield is risky and putting it right next to a pristine lake which is at the headwaters of a watershed does not make sense to me. Every community seems to run into the "not in my backyard" syndrome. I am guilty of it today. I hope that down the road you do not regret the consequences of your actions today. I also hope that at least you will give our concerns credence.

If you do implement the use of this Landfill site I respectfully request that my association be given copies of your monitoring reports as they regularly become available.


them and also bring in some new ideas. Susan Fogg said her sister-in-law would like to get involved, so we look forward to that.



Thatcher Road Boat Launch Update

After a number of failed attempts to convince MNR to repair Thatcher Road and the boat launch, our Association reached a verbal agreement with Kevin Keith from MNR last year. The Association would be responsible for the immediate repairs and accessibility of the road and MNR would look after the boat launch ramp repair.

I met with Frank Hink of Black Sturgeon (Estates) Property Owners' Association and with agreement from both Associations we each contributed \$1,100 toward road repairs. In late Fall 2008, a new culvert was installed and additional material hauled in to improve the roadbed. On inspection last fall, we were satisfied that we received value for our dollar. While this was a great start, we recognized that yearly maintenance would be required and members of our Association were open to participating in this endeavour.

In mid-May this year, Frank Hink, Ray Forzley, Kevin Keith (MNR) and I met at the boat launch. The carcasses and hides that littered the area were pointed out to Mr. Keith who indicated that he had summer help starting soon and would ensure the area was cleared. We wanted to share with Mr. Keith the work that was completed and review with him the pending repairs to the boat launch. At this time Mr. Keith advised that there was no money to fulfill their obligation. MNR had the necessary material and ramp extensions, but he suggested that we would have to take responsibility to have the work done and suggested a specific company that we could contract. At our request, he agreed to obtain an estimate. We were surprised and shocked that he was reneging on his commitment on behalf of MNR, especially after our respective Associations followed through in good faith with our own substantial monetary commitments.

At our Annual Black Sturgeon South Property Owners' Association (BSSPOA) Meeting this summer, I reported on MNR's failure to live up to their agreement and our Association voted not to dedicate additional time or money until MNR met their commitment. Our Association is reluctant to obtain the permits and pay for the work to which MNR committed.

I was on the Thatcher road the first week in September and the carcasses appeared to be removed. However, Frank advised that some members of his Association are reporting otherwise, so I will be re-confirming this in the next week or so with a visit. I still await Mr. Keith's return call regarding the estimate. Consequently, I plan to communicate in writing to MNR detailing the lack of cooperation and follow-through in hopes of obtaining fair and satisfactory action.

Liquid Dish Detergent

Grate a bar of pure soap (Ivory, Sunlight) into a sauce pan. Cover with water and simmer over low heat until they melt together. When cooled pour into a container and use as you would any dishwashing soap.

This mixture will not produce the suds you are used to but it will clean your dishes without dumping phosphates into our waters. For tough stains and cutting grease add some vinegar or lemon juice to the dish water.
