

Message From The President

Whether you have just re-opened your cottage for the season or you are a full time resident, I hope you all wintered well. This has probably been one of the hardest winters to get through in many, many years. Extreme cold and extreme snow that never seemed to end. Well it's finally gone with the ice, so welcome back to Black Sturgeon.

It has been a rather quiet winter for lake business with only two minor variance applications received by the Association. A third application was recently received, which was submitted by Moncrief and involves a pipe dock on Peterson Rd.

This past March a meeting of the BSLPOA Exec. was held with our guest being Mayor Canfield. We had been in conversation with the Mayor over the winter regarding concerns of residents on the lake and

he agreed to meet with the executive to discuss our issues. Our meeting went very well and lasted approximately two hours. We discussed The City of Kenora Mill Rate and resulting Property Taxes, MPAC Assessments, Thatcher Road, Building Permits and follow up, and lastly Hydro One.

The Mayor explained his views on these issues as well as other topics not on our agenda. In the end he agreed to attend our AGM on June 21st at The Super 8, and address the members as a group.

Make sure you mark this date on your calendar, as this is your opportunity to ask the question that you want answered.

Garbage and Recycling on Peterson Road

It's that time of the year again where we have now opened our cottages for the season and are ready to entertain and enjoy the lake. It is also that time of the year to re-visit the garbage and recycling guidelines for the containers on Peterson Road.

If the recycling bins are full, DO NOT leave your recycling outside the bins. Take it home or take it to Barsky Hill. If you crush your items you will make more room for others.

If you forgot your garbage key or tag, DO NOT Leave the bag outside the cage. Doing so only attracts animals and makes for a large clean up by other residents.

DO NOT Pile your old cottage items beside the the recycling bins. We have had tables, barbecues, light fixtures etc etc. Take these items home with you or take to Barsky's Hill. Please share the above with your guests, renters and anyone else who should know.

Last year the City of Kenora made the garbage unavailable to us for a short period of time, and will do so again if we do not abide by their rules (maybe that's the answer - remove the recycling and garbage bin)?

We ask that you guide yourselves by the above for the continued beauty of the area that we enjoy.

Peterson Road Cleanup

The Association is looking for volunteers to spend a couple of hours on a Saturday morning to clean up the garbage along Peterson Road. Every spring there is garbage that has accumulated in the ditches and roadside that's either been deliberately tossed, or has blown from the back of a contractor's truck, from the recycling bins or from construction sites. The main section of Peterson needing

cleanup is from Meadow Trail to 115 Peterson Road.

We are looking for one person to coordinate the clean-up and the volunteers. For parents with younger children it is a great opportunity to teach and encourage community involvement. Garbage bags and tags will be provided.

The Ritchie Road and Lawton Drive roadbeds wintered well and we have no complaints this year.

Pickleball




Never Give Up

The interesting thing was he didn't do the usual grab and go. In this case, he never came up which was very odd in my mind. As he was so far away I had to grab a pair of binoculars to see what had hap-

pened. To my amazement he was swimming to shore, which was about 30 meters away. The eagle would lift and rotate its wings forward above the water and pull itself through the water. When he got close to shore I could no longer see him. So, I hopped into my runabout, with my camera, to make sure he had made it. When I got to the island he was headed for, there he was on shore with what looked like a 3 foot Pike at his feet.

No wonder he couldn't snatch the fish out of the water after his dive and no wonder why he never let go. What a remarkable way to learn eagles can swim.
