


Message From The President

It's hard to believe that another summer season has passed so quickly. It seems just like yesterday that the water levels were too high to put docks in and launch boats.

It has been a relatively quiet summer as far as the association is concerned. There have been no notices by The City of Kenora regarding sub-divisions, new lots or any other items that would concern the association.

To keep everyone up to date, I met with Mayor Canfield on September 22nd to discuss open items that have been ongoing since the June AGM.

The first item we discussed was the Water Quality Testing. The Mayor confirmed that the funds are set aside and in the budget for 2015. He could not recall the \$ amount and will get back to me with this amount. During the summer I contacted Ryan Haines who was part of the 2007 Lake Study and asked him if we would be better served to complete "smaller" studies each of the next 5 years rather than one large study every 5 years. He was in total support of this and explained all the reasons why we should complete studies each year. I asked Mayor Canfield if we could do this with the funds that have been set aside. He was in support and suggested that Ryan Haines put forth a presentation to The City Council and he will push to have it passed. Depending on the cost of smaller studies and the city's budget, we may have to adjust the number of smaller annual studies or consider having the association pay the shortfall.

The next item we discussed was Thatcher Road. At the AGM it was suggested by The Mayor that we hold off on spending money to repair the road. He feels that the MNR is responsible for the maintenance and he will follow them to have it completed. The mayor and I have had conversations over the summer on this issue with little progress as far as the MNR is concerned. The Mayor has our best interests at heart, but I'm sure this is not a priority. It was recently suggested by members that we do the repairs this fall and again in the spring if needed. I think for the most part that the majority of people using Thatcher Road to pull their boats out, have done so already. Your Executive feels that it would be better to do the repairs in the spring and I will follow up with The Mayor and MNR over the winter.

If you have other suggestions on this, please let me know.

The final item we discussed was the repair of Peterson Road. Over the summer it deteriorated to the point that an accident was going to happen sooner rather than later. The repairs were completed during this same week.

In closing, I would like to wish all members the best for the upcoming seasons and we will see you in the spring.

Third Annual Black Sturgeon Lake Sailing Lessons



This past July, the third annual Black Sturgeon Lake sailing school arrived on the lake hosted at the Burns' cottage on Worona Rd. The two day school saw 30 participants learn the basics of sailing. In order to host the school the Burns relied on many volunteers who helped haul the sailboats from Black Sturgeon Lake Camps to the Burns cottage and back again at the end of the weekend. Folks like Jim and Lynda Michaluk, Ted Evans, Peter Provis and family, the Parents, Brauns and Browns, Mazurs, Walkers, Metcalfs and Marshalls, all

were instrumental in helping out this year. Thanks also to Karl Snow for letting us use his beach again this year. Also, big thanks to everyone who came to the BBQ on Saturday night and especially

participants coming out to learn the basics of sailing. A number of the kids and adults have expressed a keen interest in being more involved and perhaps next year a few fun races will be organized. Since the lessons began 6 new sailboats have arrived on the north end of the lake, so the sport is gaining quite a bit of interest. You should expect to see an announcement for registration in the Spring issue of the Newsletter for the 2015 Sailing School. It will likely be held the third weekend of July.

Municipal Elections 2014

Municipal elections are held in Ontario every four years and the next election will take place on Monday October 27, 2014. Casting a ballot or submitting nomination papers are ways for citizens to become more involved and make a difference in their community.

Voters

Are you on the voter's list? The Voters List will be available at City Hall in the Clerks department or online from September 8, until Election Day, October 27th. The Municipal Elections Act does not allow the Voters List to be posted in a public place. In order to protect personal information, viewing of the Voters List will be supervised.

Need to Change/Add Your Information to the Voters List?

Application to remove, add or amend an elector's information can be made by completing the Application to Amend Voters' List (Form EL15). In order to make changes you will be asked to provide ID from the list of Acceptable Documents for Voter Identification.

Mail-in: Complete the pdf application form and sign and mail along with a photo or scanned copy of your identification to the City of Kenora Clerks department. Mailed forms must be received in the

Clerks Department no later than Wednesday, October 22nd, 2014.

In-Person:

Complete an application in person at the Clerks department, main floor during regular business hours, Monday - Friday, 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 pm. Please remember to bring acceptable identification.

Voting Day Oct. 27:

If on voting day you are an eligible elector but you are not on the list, or your information is not correct, you can still complete an EL15 form at City Hall and vote. Please take one piece of identification showing your name and qualifying address.

A Message from the Publisher . . .

One of the most frustrating jobs of publishing our Black Sturgeon Newletter is to convert all the copy that is sent in by email to a usable format. The pages are put together on an iMac computer

using the desktop publishing program "QuarkXPress". The typestyle used for the main text is 12 point Palatino and most of the headlines are in 30 point Palatino Bold.

When copy is sent it has to be converted to a usable format which means that the line lengths are different, the type style is different, and the program which was used to type the original copy is different. Copy is usually sent in as an attachment where the original was typed using Microsoft Word, Word Perfect, or any other word processing program. These attachments first have to be downloaded and then imported into the QuarkXPress program and changed to the standard type styles to make up the pages. After the stories are imported into QuarkXPress all the returns for the line endings have to be taken out except for the end of the paragraphs. Then once the text is in the right spot it will reflow and the program will make

the lengths exactly as long as the space that is provided for that particular story.

How to Prepare Copy for the Newsletter

- 1. Open your favorite word processing program
- 2. Start typing your story but **do not hit the return key until the end of each paragraph.** The computer will end each line and return automatically to the next line.
- 3. At the end of each paragraph, hit the return key twice.

How to Email Copy

- 1. Highlight and copy the whole story
- 2. Go to your email and paste the story into your email message and send it

Now this might seem quite complicated to some people but it is really very simple. The important thing is not to use any returns except at the end of paragraphs and then copy and paste it in your email message.
